Obituary

Billy Jerome (BJ) Starr, Jr. was the first born child to the union of Billy and Katye M. Starr on 4 November 1953 in Logan County, Guthrie, Oklahoma. The family moved to Phoenix in 1960 where BJ attended Sacred Heart Catholic School, Percy L. Julian Elementary and South Mountain High Schools. Upon graduating from East High School, BJ accepted a position at Valley National Bank. In 1976, BJ began a journey with the City of Phoenix Police Department that would span over 37 years. BJ earned his Bachelors of Science degree and went on to complete a Master's Degree of Science at Webster University, Luke AF Base. Bj retired from the Police Department in 2006, however, a week later he was a reserve officer stationed at the Sky Harbor International Airport. There he remained until his death.

As a young child, BJ was intrigued with aeronautics. While most children played tag, BJ and his cousin, Guy Guyton, made and launched rockets all over the valley, with the help of his father, Billy Starr, Sr. BJ was so intrigued with aeronautical elements that he paid for and acquired a fixed wing pilot license in the late 1970s. He eventually obtained helicopter and commercial pilot licenses as well. With a helicopter license in hand, BJ became the first and only African American Helicopter Pilot to date for the Phoenix Police Department. He flew with the Air Unit from 1985 - 1997. Throughout this period BJ became a Unit Flight Instructor and a Rescue Pilot. BJ could really fly!

An entrepreneur at heart, BJ also established three businesses. The first business was "Photography by B J Starr", where he was the lead photographer as in the organization. BJ produced calendars, photographed weddings, parties and established model portfolios for numerous customers. Most people can't remember seeing him without his trusted digital camera. BJ also established two prospering computer businesses called "Starr Enterprises" and "Starr Micro Solutions". In this business, BJ sold computers and software, built webpages and offered computer support, both on line and in person. The editorial world was not safe from BJ either. He worked as a freelance editor for the International Group Airborne Law Enforcement Association (ALEA). He worked with the board and was editor for the member magazine, Airbeat, for several years. He was inspirational in launching their first website. BJ also worked as a tech freelancer for "Black Enterprise Magazine" and publisher for the magazine "Peoples Underground Beat" (PUB), which he started. Being the first to do anything was never a deterrent for BJ.

Those who knew BJ also discovered his many other hidden talents. He was comfortable in any arena to include construction, plumbing, electronics and auto mechanics. A lover of the great outdoors, he also enjoyed hunting, with guns or bows and enjoyed the camaraderie of his many friends and neighbors.

BJ was a collector of many things, one of which was friends. A kind hearted person admired and respected by so many, which is evident in the number in attendance today. He will be greatly missed.

BJ is preceded in death by his parents and one great niece. He leaves his legacy of life to his; two sons, Emil Malik Starr, (Sade) and Eric Starr; two sisters, Debra Starr Boyd (Robert) and Jerita Starr Laforcarde (Jeffrey); 9 grandchildren, 4 nephews, 1 niece and a host of great nieces and nephews and relatives. Mourning the loss of his companionship is a multitude of close friends and acquaintances.
